

# You're Invited! A Cross Generational Mission Trip

## Who can attend?

Children (Rising 6th grade and under) with a parent  
Youth (Rising 7th - 12th grades) & chaperones  
Adults of all ages

## When is the trip?

JUNE 30 - JULY 3 (SUNDAY - WEDNESDAY)  
Adults of all ages & children with a parent.  
  
JUNE 30 - JULY 6 (SUNDAY - SATURDAY)  
Youth (Rising 7th - 12th grades) & chaperones

## Where will we stay?

Free lodging is available in classrooms at First Baptist Church Whiteville. If you choose to stay at FBC-W, you will need to provide your own bedding and showers will be in mobile units.  
  
Or you may prefer to pay for lodging at an offsite hotel; the church will make hotel arrangements.

## What will we do?

Children and one parent will participate in a community VBS on Monday - Wednesday mornings and choose an afternoon activity like visiting a nursing home or working in a food pantry.  
  
Youth and adults may choose to help with Hurricane Recovery Construction (painting, hanging sheet rock), Landscaping, Group Meal Preparation, VBS, Nursing Home or Food Pantry Ministries.

## Why should I go?

## What will it cost?

Children and Adults - \$50 / person  
Plus the cost of travel (based on your choice), lodging (based on your choice), and meals during travel.  
  
Youth: \$100 / person (transportation included)  
Plus the cost of meals during travel

## More details:

The purpose of this trip is to glorify God by cultivating community within our church and meeting needs of persons in Eastern North Carolina impacted by recent hurricanes. Our motives for going are to demonstrate God's love in visible ways by serving out of our diverse spiritual gifts and God-given talents to meet physical and spiritual needs, to foster unity within our church by building bridges of friendship., and to respond to God's call to "God and make disciples."

Cross-Generational means...

All ages are invited; this includes all ages of adults, families with children, and youth. The half week trip, Sunday – Wednesday, is only available to Adults and Children. Children (Rising 6th graders and younger) must be accompanied by a parent/guardian. The full week trip, Sunday – Saturday, is only available to Rising 7th – 12th Grade Students and their Chaperones.

Schedule: We will leave after church on Sunday June 30th at 1:30 PM. Lunch will be provided at church from 12:30 – 1:00 PM. Adults and Children will stay in Whiteville, NC through lunch on Wednesday July 3 and leave by 2:00 PM to return home. Youth will leave Whiteville Saturday morning July 6 after breakfast. A more detailed schedule will be available at a later date.

Service Options : Children and one parent will participate in a community VBS on Monday - Wednesday mornings and chose an afternoon activity like visiting a nursing home or working in a food pantry. Youth and adults may chose to help with Hurricane Recovery Construction (painting, hanging sheet rock), Landscaping, Group Meal Preparation, VBS, Nursing Home or Food Pantry Ministries.

Transportation: The cost of transportation will be added to the cost of the trip for adults and children based on your choice. Youth must travel on the church bus and this cost is already included. Adults may chose to drive their own vehicle, carpool and divide the cost of gas between riders (approximately \$15/person) or ride a church bus (\$10/person).

Accommodations: Adults and families with children have the option to stay in free lodging (classrooms at First Baptist Church Whiteville) and provide your own bedding (air mattress or cot and sheets, pillows, blankets or sleeping bag). Showers will be taken in a mobile unit. Or you may prefer to pay for lodging at an offsite hotel. The church will make hotel arrangements for those who chose this option. Youth will stay at FBC-W.

Meals: Meals are included in the cost of the trip and will be prepared by our volunteers in FBC Whiteville kitchen. Meals will be eaten in the church dining hall. Cost for meals in route will be paid separately by participants. Wednesday lunch will be provided before leaving Whiteville. Participants please bring your own snacks or drinks for in between meals.

Registration form and a deposit of ½ the total cost of the trip is due by March 1, 2019. Please make checks payable to FBC Huntersville.
