What is True?

According to Merriam Webster, truth is:

- the body of real things, events and facts: ACTUALITY
 - the state of being the case: FACT

Why is Truth Important?

It's important because falsehood has consequences both in this life and the life to come. Just as an example, consider traffic signals. The truth is: green means GO and red means STOP. If you doubt that statement, at your own risk, cease to stop when the light turns red and see what happens. Good luck! You're going to need it.

But what if there is something far more consequential than running red lights—such as what's *really real* and the truth about human life? Wouldn't you want to have that information? Would you reject it out of hand without considering the facts and consequences?

What Did Jesus Say About Truth?

John 8:32 "You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

John 14:6 "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

Why Should I Believe Jesus?

Because He delivered on his claims. He claimed to be God's Son. He predicted his death by crucifixion to be followed by his resurrection from the dead 3 days following. Then He actually did it. Even his closest followers couldn't fathom this until they saw Him face to face after He was raised from death just as He said he would.

After his resurrection He was seen not only by his closest followers, but by over 500 people at one time. We have the written record of his life, works, and resurrection that was penned so soon after his death that people still living at that time could have refuted it; but, they didn't. And we have the witness of changed lives then and now by those who have trusted Him to save them from sin's consequences.

How Does This Affect Me?

Consider what happened to cause a break in mankind's relationship with God the Father. Humans chose against God, and we keep on choosing against Him. This "away-from-God" behavior is called sin, and it naturally separates us from God and the life God intended.

"For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23

"If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us."

I John 1:8

We may resist a word like "sin," but it describes something true about every human. Despite being made to "be like God," we often act in ways that are anything but good. We're selfish, we "bend" the truth to our advantage, or we choose to hurt others in our anger. No one makes us sin; we choose it often and freely, even if we try our best to do the right thing.

AND, sin comes with its own "compensation package."

"The wages of sin is death." Romans 6:23 Like a salary earned from employment, sin earns wages that lead to death, both physical and spiritual. We are broken in our relationship with each other, with God, and even within ourselves.

Is There Any Hope?

Here's the GOOD NEWS: God did not give up on us, even though we are the ones who broke his good creation. There's MORE to Romans 6:23. The full sentence reads: "For the wages of sin is death, <u>but</u> the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

God came to earth in human form to heal the brokenness that exists because of human sin. Sin earns us death, but Jesus (God) died on our behalf. Whereas we earned death, God gives us life through Jesus. "God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." Romans 5:8

Through Jesus Christ, humans are restored to right relationship with God and begin the journey toward right relationship with all of God's creation. "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them." 2 Corinthians 5:17-21
