

Who Am I? What Difference Do I Make? Where Do I Fit?

At some point in our lives, all of us think about who we are, where we came from, and where we will go when this life is over. We wonder about the purpose of life. By the time we start school, we already have compared ourselves to others our own age. How our peers perceived and interacted with us had a great influence on how we perceived ourselves. Everyone experiences the pressure to conform to others' expectations. But as we mature, we think about how we fit into the bigger picture. Outwardly, we may conform to the norm but inwardly question who we really are. The pressure to conform in order to be accepted by others can result in frustration and anger toward others and self. It leads to confusion and discontent. We may wonder, "Why do I think and feel this way? Why won't people accept me just as I feel I am?"

Feelings and fact are not always equal. We will never be comfortable in our own skin until we measure our thoughts and feelings against the One who made us. The Bible, God's word, can help us understand the truth of who we really are. **You are human**, made in the image of God and given responsibility over the earth and all that is in it. *"So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them."* Genesis 1:27. You are a person of dignity and worth in the eyes of God.

You are unique. There is no one exactly like you, not even an identical twin. Why? We only need to look at nature to see that God loves variety. Did you know there are over 24,000 species in the sunflower family alone? *"And yet, O Lord, you are our Father. We are the clay, and you are the potter. We all are formed by your hand."* Isaiah 64:8

Your life has a purpose. Did you know God created you carefully and specifically, the way an artist creates a painting? God not only knew you before you ever existed, but He had a plan and purpose for your life. No matter the circumstances of your birth, you are not an accident. *"For we are God's masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things he planned for us long ago."* Ephesians 2:10

How can we identify our true identity and

purpose? We must meet the One who made us. Meeting our creator might sound scary, and that's understandable. All of us instinctively know that we haven't lived up to who God created us to be. Though God created humanity to be a reflection of his goodness and to live a blessed (good) life on earth, humans chose against God, and we keep on choosing against him. This "away-from-God" behavior is called sin, and it naturally separates us from God and the life God intended. Romans 3:23 *"For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God."* I John 1:8 *"If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us."*
